

Steals on Wheels: October 17 to 23, 2012 — Small, Fuel-Efficient Cars

Recognizing that fuel prices have been steadily climbing the last few weeks, this edition is sharing information on five small fuel-efficient models.

If you're looking for a great deal on a fuel efficient car this weekend these models may suit your needs, with fuel economy as high as 40 mpg highway and potential savings ranging from 9.8% to 14.2%. Market average pricing on these small cars demonstrates a potential savings off Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Pricing (MSRP) equaling as much as \$2,710 off this week's selection of already very affordable vehicles.

We're all keeping our eyes on the rising fuel costs, so our chart also includes fuel economy figures to help you compare not just savings at the dealership but savings at the pump, as well. You'll find that the vehicles in this week's selections offer extremely fuel efficient mile-per-gallon ranges from 32 mpg to 40 mpg highway.

1) The best potential deal on this week's list of great discounts is the 2012 Ford Focus. The comfortable and stylish Focus starts with a Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) of \$19,095 but carries a national market average of \$16,385. That's a potential savings of 14.2%, or \$2,710, off the suggested MSRP of Ford's already affordable hatchback. Add in its excellent 28 mpg city, 40 mpg highway, 33.5 mpg combined fuel economy, and you can see how the Focus makes the top of this week's list!

2) In second place this week, the popular Fiat 500 offers a potential discount of up to 13.4 percent. That translates into a possible savings of as much as \$2,578, bringing the MSRP of Fiat's iconic little car from \$19,200 down to a market average price of \$16,622. And even though it super sporty performance, the teensy Fiat also boasts fuel economy of 30 mpg city, 38 mpg highway, and 33.9 mpg combined.

3) The Kia Forte Koup sits in the middle of the pack this week: Even though Kia's little two-door starts at an affordable \$17,950, its potential savings of 11.3 percent translates to a possible \$2,034 discount — shrinking the national market average price of Kia's little coupe down to a paltry \$15,916. Fuel economy of 24 mpg city, 33 mpg highway, and 28.2 mpg combined mean its fuel costs will be paltry as well.

4) In fourth place is the 2012 Mitsubishi Lancer Sportback, sporting a national market average price of \$17,022 thanks to a potential discount of 11.3 percent. That's as much as \$2,168 off the \$19,190 MSRP of Mitsubishi's five-door sedan.

Mitsubishi's sporty Sportback also boasts fuel economy of 24 mpg city, 32 mpg highway, and 27.8 mpg combined.

5) Even though it's in last place in this week's list, the popular Nissan Sentra still boasts up to a 9.8 percent discount; subtract its potential \$1,874 savings from its \$19,140 MSRP, and you can get Nissan's little sedan for the very small national average of \$17,266. Factor in fuel economy of 27 mpg city, 34 mpg highway, and 30.4 mpg combined, and the Sentra proves to be quite an affordable car to drive.

Last week's edition of "Steals on Wheels" demonstrated some of the best incentives available on a variety of vehicles during the month of October, so if you had your eye on one of those well-priced vehicles, keep on shopping, as many of those deals may still be available in the upcoming week at a Program Certified Dealership near you.
